TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE, A44, ENSTONE – TUESDAY 13TH APRIL – Oxfordshire County Council

Temporary Traffic Regulation Notice – S14 Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984; Temporary Road Closure and "No Waiting" restriction at Enstone, A44 Oxford Road. In the interests of public safety, it will be necessary to **close the road and impose a 'No Waiting' restriction as detailed above to facilitate carriageway surface dressing works.** A temporary Notice is being made to implement the temporary closure and will operate from 13 April 2021. The anticipated completion date is 16 April 2021, times of the closure are 05:00 to 07:30, 09:30 to 15:30 and 18:00 to 20:00. A Temporary Traffic Regulation Notice is being made to implement the temporary closure and restriction and will operate on the days shown above. Access will be maintained for emergency service vehicles and for those frontages within the closure area, subject to the progress of the works and liaison with the works supervisor. SUGGESTED ALTERNATIVE ROUTE: via A44 - A361 - B4022 and vice versa

TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE, Spelsbury, B4026 Charlbury Road – Friday 9th APRIL to facilitate carriageway repairs. The anticipated completion date is 13 April 2021 (date included)

ACCESS:Limited access will be maintained for emergency service vehicles and for frontages within the closed section of road, subject to the progress of the works. The "No Waiting" restriction means that wherever there are in place yellow "No Waiting" cones, you will not be able to park vehicles on the highway. SUGGESTED ALTERNATIVE ROUTE: via Charlbury Road – Burford Road - A361 – A44 – B4022 – Nine Acres Lane – Charlbury Road and vice versa

CENSUS

The Census is coming on 21st March. Information from the digital-first Census will help decide how services are planned and funded in our local area. Census outputs inform where millions of pounds of public funding is spent on services like transport, education, health, cycle routes, schools and dental surgeries. Everyone will receive a letter with a unique access code in the post, allowing them to complete their questionnaire online. Paper questionnaires will be available on request. ENSTONE PARISH COUNCIL

In February, the Parish Council published the priority areas identified by parishioners, following the recent survey. Following this, the Parish Council is currently in discussion with Oxfordshire County Council concerning the plans for improved signage and speed indicator devices at both ends of the village, along the A44.

The following is a list of areas also identified as of significant concern and these will be considered, subject to funding.

Improved footpaths:-

- 1. To consider the continuation of the footpath from Coxs Lane to the Sports & Social Club and onwards to the junction of Charlbury Road.
- 2. A new footpath along the Charlbury Road, from the A44 crossroads to the Hoar stone.
- 3. A new footpath along Clay Hill Close.

Road Safety:-

- a. To consider introducing a speed limit from the Hoar Stone down the Charlbury Road to the A44 crossroads.
- b. To continue to review the A44/Worths crossroads. Oxfordshire County Council (OCC) and Parish Council have been working together on this for several years – a roundabout is too costly (circa £1 million) and the staggered layout means it is unsafe for traffic lights to be installed and would be too costly. The OCC has undertaken an audit of the junction and very few accidents have occurred over several years without police presence.

Other survey results:-

There were other concerns and comments made in the survey, which will be reviewed over the coming months. The full survey is published on the Enstone Parish website (enstoneparish.org) under "Local Info".

COMMUNICATING WITH YOU - ENSTONE WEBSITE & FACEBOOK PAGE

The recent survey highlighted a number of questions about how news is communicated to parishioners:

1. A desire to have a digital version of the Ensign available.

- A large button 'ENSIGN click here' has now been placed on the top right hand side of the Enstone Parish website. When clicked a pdf version of the latest Ensign can be viewed and downloaded.
- Consideration was given for people to sign up for the Ensign to be delivered by email but it was felt that this was an unnecessary admin burden for a publication that is published and delivered as a hard copy to every household in the parish by a group of volunteers. The Ensign is paid for by contributions and advertising, therefore it will continue to be delivered to your door.

2. A desire to view visitor posts on the Enstone Facebook Page.

• The Enstone Facebook page was created a number of years ago and now has over 500 followers. It is a Facebook Business Community page and behaves differently from a Facebook Personal page in that visitor posts

are only seen when released by the editors of the page. There are three editors.

 Anyone can post on the Enstone FB page in the 'create post' section but there has been criticism that visitor posts have not been viewed by others. The editors have agreed that all visitor posts will be shared with the viewing public unless they are considered to be inappropriate. The editors will endeavour to look at the page every day in order to action posts ASAP, respond to messages, and answer queries.

Since that time past and present members have been involved in many village events, from the annual Village Show to campaigning to have white lines and a 30mph speed limit installed on the Oxford Road.
