- 7 Cleveley Road, Enstone, 21/01689/OUT Outline Planning Application for the erection of six dwellings, closure of existing access and creation of separate access for No. 7 Cleveley Road and new access for the proposed dwellings, with parking layout and landscaping scheme (with some matters reserved) Enstone Parish Council objects to this planning application
- **4 Venvell Close, Enstone, 21/01804/HHD** Replacement of conservatory roof *No objection*
- Christmas Cottage, Church Enstone, 21/01900/HHD Two storey site extension *No objection*

- Cleveley Mill, Cleveley, 21/01704/HHD & 21/01705/LBC Relocation of access to accommodation and renovation of first floor
 including addition of internal insulation No objection

OXFORDSHIRE GREAT BIG GREEN WEEK CAN YOU HELP US PROMOTE CLIMATE CHANGE?

In September (18th – 26th) communities across the UK will join together for the 'Great Big Green Week'. It will be the biggest event for climate and nature ever held in the UK and is supported by organisations including the National Trust, the Women's' Institute, Oxfam, WWF and more. It takes place just five weeks before the UN 'COP26' Climate Conference in Glasgow. The Oxfordshire Great Big Green Week will be part of this. Different organisations are already planning events and parish councils are invited to take part. People, communities and organisations of all types are asked to hold an event during the week or join one of the larger events across the county.

The 'Week' will link environment, arts and community organisations to help people to take action and to send the strongest possible messages to politicians in the UK and world leaders at the UN event. That message is that 'we are doing what we can, and we need you to step up and act for our climate and environment'.

Oxfordshire Great Big Green Week is reaching out to schools, businesses, faith organisations, sports clubs and everyone else (as well as parish councils). We are pleased that the new Green Arts Oxfordshire Network that links about 80 artists and organisations. The Week is being organised by a voluntary network. The coordinating group includes:

PARISH SURVEY – UPDATES

- One-Way System Village Shop Many residents have requested that a one-way system be introduced at the village shop. The cost of this would be circa £8,000.00 and so this project is currently on hold.
- Wig Wag School Signs The Parish Council has worked with the County Council and these signs should be being repaired shortly.
- New Village Signs and Speeding Signs Good progress is being made and new signage and signs should be installed within the next few weeks. The Parish Council thanks Cllr. Glendinning for all her hard work with this.
- Installation of pavements Quotes have been obtained from Oxon County Council ranging from £29K (Coxs Lane) to £85K (Charlbury Road junction to The Firs junction). A pavement at Clay Hill Close will cost circa £46K. These are beyond the Parish Council's budget. Further quotes will be obtained.

BEGINNER'S GARDENING COURSE

The Magic of Gardening is a course running over eight weeks with a two-hour session once a week in the Parish Hall in Enstone. Two parallel courses will be available starting in the week beginning the 19th July, one on Sundays 6-8pm and another on Tuesdays 11-1pm.

The course will begin with the fundamentals of gardening and progress onto selected content from the Royal Horticultural Society's (RHS) Level 2 Certificate in Horticulture. I am a professional landscape and garden designer with RHS advanced horticultural knowledge and twenty years' experience. Whether you have prior experience in gardening or not, this will give you the tools to understand what is happening in your garden and enable you to work effectively with the space you have. 
