• Great Tew Farms Partnership, The Great Tew Estate, Quarry Farm, Great Tew, Chipping Norton, OX7 4AH for planning permission: *extraction of limestone and deposit of imported clay to achieve an agricultural restoration (part retrospective) at Land at*  *Quarry Farm North of Green Lane, Green Lane, Great Tew, OX7 4NS:* Ref: MW.0100/21 – Parish Council objects

- Great Tew Farms Partnership, The Great Tew Estate, Quarry Farm, Great Tew, Chipping Norton, OX7 4AH for planning permission: Temporary change of use to mineral processing and storage area at Enstone Airfield North, Land at Enstone Airfield North, Banbury Road, Enstone, OX7 4NS: Ref: MW.0102/21 – Parish Council objects

We are delighted to announce that Enstone Park is having a makeover! After many years of raising funds, planning and meeting with playground companies, we have contracted a local specialist, who also built play equipment for many of the local parks including Charlbury, Middle Barton, Shipton under Wychwood, to create our new village park. Some of the current equipment will be staying but much of it will be newly built. This does mean that unfortunately our playing park area will be closed until late November (weather dependent) while the new play equipment is installed.
