THE FEAST OF THE EPIPHANY 2022

As we start this new year, we celebrate the feast of the Epiphany. This is another revealing of the child Jesus – this time to the gentile kings from Persia, India, and Arabia. The first revealing was that of God in Jesus, a private event for his parents, the second, Isaiah's 'Light has dawned' is Epiphany, and the third Candlemas. Epiphany is imaged by three kings, or wise men, or astrologers, who walked and rode in heat and cold bearing grandiose gifts: gold to symbolise the role of the recipient and frankincense and myrrh for the adult Jesus' female companions to anoint his body at death, for there is no Epiphany without Easter. The three revealings make clear Jesus is for all, all people, across the world and in this village, all becoming co-inheritors of God's promised grace exemplified in Christ's faithfulness and grounded in the Spirit. Given that, as Luther put it, 'we should deal with all our neighbours as we see that God through Christ has dealt with and still deals with us.'

Our current exemplar is the late Archbishop Tutu, who followed God in Christ, prompted decades ago to follow the way of the Cross by the Anglican priest Trevor Huddleston who during early apartheid years, doffed his cap to Tutu's mother. Tutu insisted both that 'We are made for goodness,' and 'light overcomes darkness and love hate.' That is his ongoing offering to us. What might be *our* offering at the start of a new year, to *our* neighbours, near and far?

We may be sickly, struggling with illness; we may be anxious about or grieving for family members and friends; we may be horrified about the desolation in parts of this country and the world. But however frail we feel we can, through eye or touch, express our thankfulness to those who are there for us: whatever our knowledge of God, we can and should give thanks for God's love. Then, replete in that love, we can offer ourselves, revealing that of Christ as we gladly live for ourselves, our neighbours and God. If as Irenaeus says, 'the glory of God is a human being fully alive,' only the fully alive, however weak, fragile or worried we may feel, can deal with neighbours as God deals with us. May this year be our lively offering to the glory of God

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS – DECEMBER 2021 (mtg held 6/1/2022) <u>Planning Applications</u>:-

• Enstone Airfield North, Banbury Road, 21/03722/FUL – Erection of a detached building to provide administration, welfare and storage facilities for aircraft maintenance business, flying school and resident pilots:-

- Three Parish Councillors voted in favour of the application.
- Two Parish Councillors voted against the application.

- Two Parish Councillors abstained.
- One Parish Councillor presented views against the application but was not allowed to vote as he joined the meeting via zoom. Current legislation means that he was unable to vote unless he was in person in the room.
- One Parish Councillor declared an interest in the application and left the room during the discussion.
- One Parish Councillor had sent apologies and was unable to attend the meeting.

Comments:

1. No residents attended the meeting to discuss this planning application, but it was noted that there were 17 letters of objection on the planning portal.

2. It is recommended that WODC undertakes a site visit to establish how the electricity will be supplied via solar panels, to ensure the site is environmentally sustainable.

3. That the planning officers consider the environmental impact of the planning application.

4. That the planning officers consider the visual impact of the proposed building.

5. Enstone Parish Council requests a meeting with WODC, the regulators of the Airfield, to consider legal conditions as part of the application, should it be approved, regarding flying activities.

Dorden Cottage, Lidstone, 21/03777/HHD – Erection of a replacement porch – No objection

Decisions Received:-

• **14 The Spinneys, Enstone** – Erection of first floor extension over existing garage and provision of external staircase – *Approved*

• **Southcombe Farm, Oxford Rd** – Rear two storey extension with internal alterations – *Approved*

• **Land East of The Drive, Enstone** – Construction of two detached selfbuild custom-build carbon-neutral houses, together with associated works & formation of vehicular access – *Withdrawn*

• **7 Cleveley Road, Enstone** – Outline planning application for the erection of 4 dwellings, closure of existing access, and creation of separate

access for No. 7 Cleveley Road & new access for the proposed dwellings, with parking layout and landscaping scheme (with some matters reserved) (Amended Plans) – *Withdrawn*

ENSTONE AIRFIELD – UPDATE FROM WODC, REGULATORS OF THE AIRFIELD

<u>The following correspondence has been received from WODC</u>:-*It is claimed that the run of seven hangars is lawful.*

In terms of the alleged breach of flying hours, there is no 'material' evidence that the planning condition that relates to aircraft movements across the airfield is being breached. The condition allows for up to 200 movements per day with no more than 40 of the movements taking place in any one hour. Officers, when visiting the airfield for various reasons, monitor aircraft movements. During the last visit, Officers noted that within a one and a half hour period whilst on site, there were two movements, one take off and one landing. At an earlier date in October 2021 when on site for approximately fifty minutes, one movement was noted.

IMPROVING ENSTONE'S SAFETY We need your help

Enstone Parish Council receives many concerns from residents regarding speeding vehicles within the Parish. Oxfordshire County Council is implementing a "20's Plenty" scheme but requires evidence from Town and Parish Councils that this is required (replacing the current 30 mph signs to 20 mph) within individual parishes. The evidence required is through speed check surveys.

Members of Enstone PC have been undertaking these for several years and forwarding the results to Thames Valley Police. *However, no further speed surveys can be undertaken until there are sufficient volunteers to help.* One resident has offered to help following the request in November's issue but we need more. Please do contact me for further information.
