#### LETTER FROM THE RECTORY

Long live The Queen!

This month we celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. She is the longest reigning monarch in British history. In fact, she is now the third longest reigning monarch of all time, after King Louis XIV of France and King Bhumibol of Thailand. Up until recently she attended church every week and still does a full week's work at the age of 96!

It is her commitment to serving God and the nation which stands out in her life. Even before she became Queen, she made a promise, which she has kept for over 75 years: 'I declare before you all that my whole life, whether it be long or short, shall be devoted to your service' (21st birthday broadcast, 21 April 1947).

What is the secret of the Queen's consistency of character and service? In 2002 she said this: "I know just how much I rely on my faith to guide me through the good times and the bad. Each day is a new beginning. I know that the only way to live my life is to try to do what is right, to take the long view, to give of my best in all that the day brings, and to put my trust in God." These are wise

words from somebody who draws her strength from the Christian Faith and can inspire all of us who want to make our lives count.

The Queen has been an example of joyful, wise, and generous service on behalf of others all her life. Six months before her coronation she asked the nation and Commonwealth to "pray that God may give me wisdom and strength to carry out the solemn promises I shall be making, and that I may faithfully serve Him and you, all the days of my life."

On Sunday 5th June at 10 am in St Nicholas' Church, Chadlington there will be a special service for all the villages of the Benefice to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. We will join others throughout our land and the Commonwealth in giving thanks to God for her faithful service and to pray for her as she celebrates this important milestone. We do hope that you will be able to join us!

# **Planning Applications**:-

- \* Premises Licence Variation Heythrop Leisure and Spa. Variation of the alcohol licence for the leisure and spa area. This is a standard throughout the Bourne Leisure group. Mr D Saunders explained the purpose of these licence variations. No objection
- \* Heythrop Park Hotel & Conference Centre Variation of premises alcohol licence to allow residents at the hotel to purchase alcohol to take to their rooms or take on a picnic in the grounds. No objection.
- \* Land at Chapel Lane, 22/00838/OUT The meeting held on the 23rd May, to discuss the building plans for Chapel Lane, attracted many villagers to hear the plans. Mr J Tait set out the proposal for eight properties and green spaces, pedestrian and vehicular accesses. Many villagers had questions about the parking spaces allocated, the ecology of the site, and the benefit to the village. Villagers were encouraged to put their comments on the plans on the WODC planning portal.

The consultation period has been extended to the 17th June to allow comments. Villagers unable to access the planning portal may send their comments to chairenstoneparish@gmail.com. The 39 residents who attended the meeting Objected, as did the Parish Councillors.

## **QUEEN'S JUBILEE**

- The Queen would like her 70 year Platinum Jubilee to be marked by the planting of trees, *The Queen's Green Canopy (queensgreencanopy.org)*, and so the Parish Council is working with the Enstone Eco Group to make 70 silver birch trees available to families in Enstone for planting locally. All children at Enstone Primary School will, in addition, be given a small memento of the jubilee and will be invited to join the Green Canopy initiative, by registering with the Parish Council to acquire one of the young trees in a plant pot. The trees may then be planted either in private gardens (with permission) or, later in the year, at one of several locations in the village (under appropriate supervision). In the June Ensign we will publish more details about the local scheme and how to register to get your tree in a pot.
- Other organisations will be reporting separately in this month's Ensign, regarding other activities that are taking place during the Jubilee weekend.
