LETTER FROM THE RECTORY

According to British folklore, if it rains on 15th July, then we can expect 40 days of showery and stormy weather. This myth arose after the buried remains of St Swithun was removed from its original site in a church garden and taken into a Saxon cathedral.

Swithun was an Anglo-Saxon Bishop of Winchester. During his decade in office, he was known for his devotion and passion to build new churches and to restore old ones.

Before he died on 2nd July 863 AD, he didn't want any veneration of his tomb and requested that his body be simply interred in the church grounds. He wanted people to pass by his grave and for it to be touched by the weather. So far so good. But – a century later, it was decided to move Swithun inside, into the refurbished basilica. From that day it rained every day for nearly six weeks – as if this was his displeasure at being moved!

The Bible mentions rain (and water) many times. These include the great flood and Noah's Ark (Genesis 7); Ezra's open-air public assembly in Jerusalem in

the pouring rain (Ezra 10:9) and the parable by Jesus about two houses in a rainstorm (Matthew 7:24-27).

Over the centuries, hymn writers have also used water and rain to describe our need for God. They've used such phrases as *I need Youlike refreshing summer rain and Father, like rain from the skies send Your word into our lives*. Some hymns include rain as a metaphor for the Holy Spirit to come and refresh, restore and revitalise us; to cleanse us of our sins or to wash away our sorrows.

Here are two verses and the chorus from an old hymn written by Daniel W. Whittle (1840-1901) that reminds us that when overwhelmed with gloom and despair, God can and will pour new hope into our lives.

There shall be showers of blessing, this is the promise of love; There shall be seasons refreshing, sent from the Saviour above. There shall be showers of blessing, O that today they might fall, Now as to God we're confessing, now as on Jesus we call! Showers of blessing, showers of blessing we need; Mercy-drops round us are falling, but for the showers we plead.

• Convent Cottage, Radford, 22/01202/HHD – Erection of single storey extensions to create additional bedroom and garden room with spa room and storage beneath, enlarge reception room and provision of terrace above and formation of lobby, boiler room and bin store.

Helping us all to do the right thing.

Hello again from Enstone Eco. We recently took part in the nationwide "Big Plastic Count" which revealed some staggering data about our plastic packaging waste: 12% recycled, 18% exported, 24% goes to landfill and 46% is incinerated.* These statistics are quite shocking, but it does highlight that too much single-use plastic is still produced, without reusable alternatives. Please continue to Reduce, Reuse and Recycle.

You can take your fly away plastics/crisp packets to M&S or the Co-op recycling boxes. Use the local markets to buy seasonal produce. Try looking for a "Zero Waste" shop where you can refill your containers, OATS in

Chipping Norton do detergent refills. Take your toothpaste tubes and lipsticks to Boots and used pens to Rymans. And have fun growing your own food!

ENSTONE ECO – PLANT A TREE FOR THE JUBILEE

The Parish Council have 40 Silver Birch tree wands to give away to local residents as part of the Queens Jubilee Tree canopy project. Please fill in the tear off slip below, then "post" it in the special box in Adams Stores. The wands are available on a "first come, first served" basis, and successful wand adoptors will be contacted in the autumn, when it will be the right time to plant them. When deciding to have a tree please consider the following points:

- ❖ Silver Birch trees can reach 25 metres tall
- ❖ In 10 years the tree could grow 8 meters tall with a 3 metre spread
- ❖ They need to be planted 3 metres from the house
- ♣ And 2.5 to 3 metres from drainage pipes or a wall
- ❖ When planting more than one they should be spaced one metre apart
- ❖ These trees mature in about 15 25 years
- ♣ It is hoped to create a map to show where these special trees have been planted for the Queens Platinum Jubilee.
