- o Land and Building (E) 439518 (N) 226211 Enstone Airfield North, Banbury Road, 22/01915/FUL- Erection of a detached building to provide administration, welfare and storage facilities for the aircraft maintenance business, flying school and resident pilots. *No Objection:* Enstone Parish Council does, however, acknowledge the ongoing concerns of some residents regarding increased activity at the airfield and suggest that West Oxfordshire District Council consider undertaking a comprehensive flight activity analysis to establish the extent of aircraft movements as this is an issue that is raised by parishioners regularly.
- o **The Old Coal Yard, Gagingwell, 22/02111/FUL-** Change of use to single storey Unit 3 from hobby/artist's studio (20/00097/CLE) to flexible use Class B8 and Class E to support Café on site. *No Objection*.

#### **Road closures:**

TTRO (T10294) Temporary Road Closure; No waiting – Church Enstone, B4022 Banbury Road - Please note that this road closure was previously mentioned in the last Ensign. The road closure will be in place from the Tew crossroads (intersection of B4030/B4022), heading north to the delivery entrance for Soho Farmhouse on the Banbury Road (B4022). The

closure will be in place from 5th September 2022 and is anticipated that the work will be completed by 7th October 2022. This is being highlighted to confirm that the B4030 through Church Enstone itself will remain open.

Temporary Road Closure; No Waiting - Lidstone, road running through Lidstone - In the interests of public safety to facilitate carriageway drainage and patching works, a temporary Notice is being made to implement the temporary closure and will operate from 7 November 2022. The anticipated completion date is 11 November 2022. This is a 24 hour per day closure. Access will be maintained for emergency service vehicles and for those frontages within the closure area, subject to the progress of the works and liaison with the works supervisor.

Temporary Road Closure at Lidstone, road running through Lidstone

A request has been received from Morrison Water Services for a temporary road closure to apply to a length of the road running through Lidstone, whilst excavation and reinstatement are carried out to install a new washout system. The closure will be in place from 14 November 2022 up to and including 16 November 2022. This is a 24 hour per day closure.

The Enstone Show held on the 20th August was hailed by many of the public attending as a great success. From an organisers point of view the hard work before the event and anxiety on the day was dispelled as the crowds seemed just to appear. So to everyone who attended a big 'thank you' because there would be no show without your presence. Even the weather which had cast a shadow before the opening brightened up and burst into sunshine. Admittedly the westerly wind made its presence felt on a number of the gazebo's but didn't dampen spirits and a number of people were heard to say it was the best show they had been to!

So, to start with the opening, our very own Graeme Garden did the honours in his usual witty manner. As the dog show registration took place we were delighted by a performance of Indian classical dancing organised by Amoo, wife of Karan, one of the new owners of Adams Stores. By this point the crowd had swelled and the dog show started. This year our judges were Emma Hills and Louisa Hebdon (Guide Dogs for the Blind), who should both be congratulated for their expertise. The Anne Mansbridge Cup for Champion of Show was awarded to 'Monty' and owner John Pritchard.

Of course other attractions were taking place; Morris Dancers from Finstock & Charlbury were entertaining with singing and dancing, hankies, sticks, heys & rounds, balancing the straw all under the experienced eye of the 'Big Cheese'. We were short on stalls this year, mainly due to the aftermath of the pandemic but the Guide Dogs for the Blind, Dogs for Good, BBOWT returned. Warner Leisure, who contributed to a number of extraordinary raffle prizes were there to talk through their plans for Heythrop Park. The Enstone WI had delicious

home baked cakes and other goodies to tuck into. For those wanting to eat something hot, Copper Pot provided food for all dietary needs and the burger & chips I had were especially delicious. Rosetti Ice Creams also did a roaring trade in the sunshine. As usual the Enstone Sports & Social Club arranged the Skittles and provided teas and licensed bar.

There was something for everyone and the children enjoyed the Octopus Ride and Face Painting. We are so lucky to have Heythrop Zoological Gardens providing animals at every show and this year they had a donkey, Shetland pony, squirrel monkeys, penguins, tortoise and lemur. Another welcome attraction was Mabel, Worth's 1950's bus, made even more important as this year is Worth's centenary. Paul Worth presented Claudia Grainger with a wonderful trophy for her picture of the Queen painted for this year's Jubilee celebrations. After many years of trying (weather / pandemic) the climbing wall arrived and many children and adults had hours of fun clambering up and down it.

Enstone Eco Group had 4 electric cars and 2 electric bicycles on show and spoke to many people about owning an electric car and their plans to promote a greener society. Next to them was Enstone School, which ran a successful Tombola. This year the Show Committee decided to give the proceeds of the grand raffle and show to Enstone School & Pre-School.
