<u>Alternative Fuel Payments</u>:- A resident has requested that this fuel payment be advertised

Alternative Fuel Payments (domestic)

This scheme is intended to deliver a one-off payment of £100 to UK households who are not on the mains gas grid and therefore use alternative fuels, such as heating oil, to heat their homes. Powers will enable the government to deliver support via electricity bills in both GB and NI, under a similar delivery model to the Energy Bills Support Scheme. The payment will ensure that a typical customer using heating oil does not face a higher rate of growth in their heating costs since last winter, in comparison to those using mains gas who are supported by the Energy Price Guarantee. The government will set out the timing of this payment soon.

Botley West Solar Farm

If this goes ahead, it would be the fourth largest solar farm in the world and would occupy more than 3,400 acres North & West of Oxford city, more than three quarters of which would be on Oxford's green belt. This information is already on the parish website (closing date for comments 22^{nd} December) – there will be a second developer-led consultation in Spring 2023. The Botley West proposal circumvents all local planning procedures and will go directly to the Government's Planning Inspectorate for final approval as a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project (NSIP).
