Coronation of King Charles III

The Parish Council approved a budget of £1,500.00 towards celebrations in the parish. The budget will include roadside bunting, a coronation souvenir coin to be presented to children in the Parish, and a contribution towards an event on coronation weekend (6/7 May). A committee to organise the event is being formed. Any groups or individuals who would like to join the organising committee please contact the parish clerk in the first instance.

The coronation souvenir coin bearing the head of Charles III will be distributed through the Enstone Primary School and the Brownies. A limited number of additional coins will be made available on a 'first come, first served' basis for children from the parish who do not attend Enstone School. Interested

parents of children under 14 who are not at the school should contact the Parish Clerk to be added to a list.

Litter Picking Weekend – Update

Over the weekend (18-19 March) a valiant group of villagers took to the roads and hedgerows in and around Enstone to collect litter. A vast quantity of rubbish bags were filled. Whilst congratulations are in order for those who turned up to carry out this work, it does not prevent it from happening as sadly we live in a 'throw away' society. Enstone Parish Council Survey – 2020 – Update – March 2023

Enstone Parish Council carried out a Survey in November 2020, asking parishioners a variety of questions about living in the parish of Enstone.

Actions - dated February 2021 - Updates

Enstone Parish Council wishes to thank the residents who completed the recent survey/questionnaire. It has proved to be most beneficial in determining our priorities for the next few years. We will be publishing further responses to the survey in the Ensign and website over the next few months starting with the key priorities.

The following key areas have been identified in order of priority:

Roads and Signage

To install improved digital speed indicator devices at both ends of Enstone, along the A44 - *Completed*

To have improved signage at both ends of the A44, the B4022, Banbury Road and Charlbury Road when entering Enstone - *Completed*

To fund a feasibility study (organised by Oxfordshire County Council) for 20 mph signs along The Drive, Coxs Lane, Cleveley Road, Lidstone Road, along the B4030 from the A44 junction to Church Enstone and along the A44 through Enstone – Completed, awaiting to hear from Oxon County Council on start date of this scheme

To have a one-way system at the village shop. The Parish Council has set aside £15,000 in the current budget towards the above works – *The Parish Council is*

currently organising for the one way system to be implemented as per the parish survey results.

Footpaths

Repair of the Planks – Oxfordshire County Council aims to repair this area in spring/summer 2021. The repair works will be paid for by OCC and the Parish Council. The Parish Council has budgeted £5,000.00 towards the works - *Completed*

As ever, the Spring Term has whizzed by; however, in this short second half we have still managed to pack lots in. Our Key Stage 2 pupils enjoyed a visit from a pop up planetarium in February, which helped to underpin the learning in their science topic of "Earth and Space" as well as giving everyone a rare opportunity to sit "under the stars" with no light pollution! - Grab your <u>FREE wildflower seeds</u> from the Ensign box in the shop. When your wildflowers are grown why not take a photo and send to us <u>enstoneeco@gmail.com</u>
- Maybe you'd like to <u>plant your own cut flower patch</u> as well as some wildflowers. This would enable you to make flower posies for your family & friends and increase the biodiversity of your garden. Think of the air miles you'd save! Most supermarket flowers are imported from hotter climates. Why not try some: Sweet peas, Sunflowers, Cosmos, Corncockle, Nigella, Dahlias or Roses and successionally plant for a summer full of flowers. Get planting and have fun in your garden!
- Nature's Calendar Project Nature is full of clues of the changing seasons, and we need to help The Woodland Trust track them. Scientists use these records to investigate how wildlife is responding to climate change. Could you help record the signs of the changing seasons near you? In April you might watch out for/record: 1st sight of an orange tip butterfly, Swifts arrival, Garlic mustard first flowers or BlueTits feeding their young. Check out the Woodland Trust website www.woodlandtrust.org.uk and search for Nature's Calendar for recording information.

- Go along to the <u>Free Citizen Science Saturday</u> 22nd April 10-4pm Charlbury Scout Hut & Wigwell Nature reserve. Beaver Dam building, Tree ID, Water Quality sampling as part of Evenlode Waterblitz, Butterfly survey, Arts and Crafts & refreshments are just some of the activities on offer.

KING CHARLES III CORONATION – SAT 6TH MAY

There will be several events happening across Enstone to celebrate the Coronation of King Charles III on Saturday 6th May and everyone from Enstone and the surrounding area is strongly encouraged to take part. Although the final timings have not yet been announced, it is assumed that the proceedings will commence at 11AM and will end with an appearance of the King and Queen Consort on the balcony of Buckingham Palace at 2PM.

The Parish Hall will be open from 10.30 AM and will be screening the proceedings on the Large Screen in the hall. Tea, Coffee, and Cake will be served in the Hall and there will also be a cash bar.

Charlbury ArtRoom opened at the beginning of last year and is now well established in The Corner House in the centre of town. It is in a large, warm, well-lit room with huge windows and a wooden floor.

It is well stocked with art materials for members to use, there are easels available and a small library of art books. We are very proud of our large etching press which is perfect for intaglio and relief printmaking.

The project was set up under the umbrella of The Charlbury Art Society to

support creativity in the community. It provides space for people who either do not have enough room at home or who like to work together with others to learn and share ideas. The kettle is always on.

Members can have the use of a large part of this room for £ 2.50 per week, the cost of buying a coffee. You can choose your day to share with a small group of other artists. The room is secure, and you will have a large box in which to store your materials. The space is available at all times of the day to members who have the entry code.

In addition to individual activity the room is ideal for workshops and for group creative activities. We are always looking for people to organise workshops and to run them in the evenings or at weekends.
