Planning Applications:-

- Leys Farm Cottage, Little Tew Road, Church Enstone, 23/00883/ HHD – Demolition of annex and replacement with 2 storey side extension and single storey front extension forming new porch. Proposed single storey link extension to attach the proposed extension with the existing building – No objection
- Land at Manor Farm, Chapel Lane, Enstone, 23/01121/FUL Formation of new field access onto A44. This was a split decision vote but the casting vote from the Chair meant that the PC objected to this planning application. Concern was raised regarding pedestrian safety, particularly children, with farm machinery entering onto the A44.

ENSTONE PRIMARY SCHOOL NEWS – ECO WARRIORS SPECIAL REPORT

Our Eco Warriors have continued their good work this year, having passed last summer's assessment with flying colours. In September, Mrs Rachel Pearson took over the job of leading our team and helping them to build their portfolio of evidence for the next Green Flag assessment. In November, our older Eco Warriors attended the FarmEd Eco Conference. Inspired by a talk on bat conservation, they went on to arrange an assembly speaker and fundraising for the Oxfordshire Bat Group. The conference also led to a visiting speaker delivering a fantastic and impassioned presentation to our Key Stage 2 classes on river pollution, following which the children wrote to MP Robert Courts to ask for his support in this matter. We await his reply.

Continuing the river theme, Mrs Pearson has arranged for our Key Stage 2 classes to engage with the Evenlode Catchment Project. Our pupils will soon be doing some river surveys and looking at habitats around the riverbank. The team have also been the driving force behind many recycling initiatives in school, including "Relove Your Stuff" (a good-as-new clothing, books and toys sale), recycling stamps to raise money for "Thrive" and recycling batteries to stop them from going into landfill. They were also able to properly dispose of a great deal of recyclable rubbish collected on their litter pick, which was timed to coincide with "The Great Big School Clean 2023".

Well done to the team and thank you to Mrs Pearson for coordinating all our Eco work this year. There is still half a term to go, and more work to do, but we are confident that our efforts will once more be recognised by "Eco Schools".

NATURE NOTES

How wonderful recently to have seen a little goldcrest swinging on the branches of a flowering shrub just outside my kitchen window, pecking at ants and insects that seem to be swarming everywhere this year. The perceived wisdom some 50 years ago was that one could use an ant powder or spray to kill these "pests", as they were considered then, whereas now these little birds do the job much better while saving the environment. Last year it was a wren picking off the ants off my window ledge. Did you know that cow parsley attracts the sort of insects that wrens like to feed on, as there is plenty of cow parsley in my garden, the wrens come here all the year round!

Talking of ants, there are loads in my garden this year, and just this morning (mid-May) I saw a green woodpecker on the lawn, who likes to feed on ant maggots and clears it all up. As they say, too much tidiness is not good for

wildlife and if you let the birds do it, they tidy up the garden without any need for poisons.

Another thing we were all meant to do in a bygone age was to cut down your flowering perennials in the autumn under the heading of "tidying up" the garden. Well I left not just my tall Michaelmas daisies but my Japanese anemones (5 ft high), still standing mid-May, and lo and behold! Goldfinches came and fed off the seed-heads as late as May 11! I'd rather have the birds and a bit of "untidiness", than a sterile, tidy patch.

I suppose it's all a matter of balance really, one learns all the time!
