Planning Applications:-

7 Cleveley Road, Enstone, 23/01191/873 – Variation of condition 2 (amended plans) of planning permission 21/04076/FUL to allow design changes (erection of 2 detached dwellings with associated parking and provision of new vehicular accesses to service existing and new dwellings) – PC has concerns regarding lack of parking spaces at this site.

Co-option of Parish Councillor

Enstone Parish Council co-opted Mr. Mike Gomm onto the Parish Council at its meeting on 29th June and is looking forward to Mike being part of the Parish Council.

Overgrown Vegetation from residents' properties obstructing pavements

Please remember to cut back all overhanging vegetation from your property that obstructs public footpaths and bridleways etc. The pavement along the A44 from The Paddocks to the centre of Enstone is particularly difficult to walk along due to overhanging vegetation. Thank you.

Overgrown vegetation – Cleveley footpath

The Parish Council contacted OCC regarding the overgrown footpath last September – the work to cut back this vegetation is programmed for this summer.

Damaged Walls

The Parish Council has reported the damaged wall along Chapel Lane to the County Council. It is also obtaining quotes for repair of the damaged wall along the boundary of the sports club – the quotes are too expensive for this work to be carried out. The wall and bollards outside Enstone Primary School are also in need of repair and the Parish Council has contacted the County Council about this.

Traffic Calming/20s Plenty Campaign for Enstone Parish

Oxfordshire County Council meets on 20th July to discuss Enstone's 20s Plenty Campaign and whether this scheme will be approved. Enstone Parish Council has agreed to fund signage for 30 mph for the whole length of Coxs Lane and also 30 mph at the A44/Charlbury Road junction, up to the Coxs Lane junction. Enstone PC is also campaigning for the A44 to become a 20 mph limit.

Road Closures - OCC-

- Temporary Road Closure, Enstone, Cleveley Road from 14th August to 18th August
- Temporary Road Closure, Enstone, B4022 Banbury Road from 25th September to 6th October

ENSTONE ECO *Helping Enstone Parish to make a difference!* Action for Insects – It is most encouraging to see that many in the village have adopted a 'No Mow May' approach to some or all their garden. Keep it going! These areas are invaluable for our insects, providing more flowers for pollinators and allowing other plant species to flourish. Have you spotted the common Hover fly, the Marmalade fly? Its larvae are the predators of aphids and so it is a friend to the 'non-pesticide' gardener. Its pupae are an interesting find too!

Plant for all stages of an insect's life cycle – Do you have the plants to support the caterpillar stage of different moths and butterflies? The Hummingbird Hawk Moth caterpillar likes to feed on Lady's Bedstraw and the adult moth likes tube shaped flowers like Buddleia and Verbena. Get in touch with us on <u>enstoneeco@gmail.com</u> to tell us about your specific butterfly or moth and which plants are necessary to support it.

Swift return – have you noticed the Swifts in Chapel Lane? What an amazing journey returning from Africa to nest in the UK! Maybe you can help them in the future with a nest box from RSPB.

ENSTONE PRIMARY SCHOOL NEWS – OUR SCHOOL VALUES (special report)

We began the new academic year by identifying seven values that we wanted to adopt as our Enstone Primary School Values, the aim being to live out the spirit of these values in our work and in our play, every day, as members of the school community. Our chosen values are Respect, Kindness, Responsibility, Gratitude, Teamwork, Honesty and Perseverance. Throughout each term, we have focused on these values, encouraging the children to uphold and demonstrate them and to recognise and celebrate them in each other. For our youngest children, remembering and naming the values has been made easier through linking an animal to each value and creating a story to explain how they came by their name, for example "Respectful Rabbit", "Persevering Penguin" or "Honest Owl". Soft toy mascots help our little ones to remember the behaviours we want to see demonstrated, and make frequent visits to our celebration assemblies. For the older children, we have focused on identifying "famous faces" whom we feel embody our values. The children came up with many interesting ideas and proposals, including Marcus Rashford for Perseverance and Mother Teresa for Kindness. Most importantly, the language of our school values can be heard around the school on a daily basis, and we see plenty of examples of the positive behaviours that we are trying to teach our pupils.
