BUTTERFLIES, BEES AND FLOWERS AT ST KENELM'S **CHURCHYARD**

After just two no-mow months, April and May, nearly 40 species of plants were identified. In June we were rewarded with Pyramidal and Bee Orchids, and a good showing of Lady's Bedstraw, important for the humming bird hawk-moth caterpillar. The Spear Thistles are now in full flower, hosting White-tailed and Common Carder bees. On sunny days, there have been Large and Small White butterflies, Green-veined Whites, Brown Argus, Meadow Brown and Gatekeepers. The mown paths weave through the whole of the churchyard so that visitors can stroll around. Just before the end of term in July, pupils from Years 5 and 6 at Enstone School came on a visit led by people from Cotswolds National Landscape. There will be a whole-site mow in August, and all the

grass cuttings will be cleared. Seeds have already dropped and will lie dormant till next year, when we hope even more species will return to this rich habitat.

Planning Applications:-

- Land and Building (E) 439518 (N) 226211 Enstone Airfield North, Banbury Road, 23/01569/FUL Erection of detached, single and two storey, air traffic control facility, including associated offices for staff and flying school users, we facilities and garage for fire and rescue vehicle. The Parish Council objects to this planning application particularly in relation to a second control tower. The PC requests that the Planning Officer at WODC obtains views of the Civil Aviation Authority.
- Whiteways Technical Centre, Enstone, 23/01714/FUL Demolition of an existing single storey timber clad gymnasium building. Construction of a two storey extension to the existing two storey ESO building, including undercroft car parking, roof mounted plant and photovoltaic panels, ground level external plant area, alterations to the existing building envelope to form roof access, rooflights, windows and

doors; and associated works including construction of an earth bunded drainage infiltration basin in the southern section of the site. Traffic Calming/20s Plenty Campaign for Enstone Parish

Oxfordshire County Council will now meet on 7th September to discuss Enstone's 20s Plenty Campaign and whether this scheme will be approved. Enstone Parish Council has agreed to fund signage for 30 mph for the whole length of Coxs Lane and also 30 mph at the A44/Charlbury Road junction, up to the Coxs Lane junction. Enstone PC is also campaigning for the A44 to become a 20 mph limit. Enstone PC requests that residents keep to the current speed limits.

HUMANITY IN ACTION: FIRST-HAND EXPERIENCE OF LIFE UNDER THE ISRAELI MILITARY OCCUPATION IN THE WEST BANK OF PALESTINE

From January to April this year, I joined a team of international volunteers in Hebron as part of the Ecumenical Accompaniment Programme in Palestine and Israel (EAPPI). Hebron is a Palestinian city in the southern part of the Occupied West Bank, about 25 miles south of Jerusalem. It's an Arab city of 220,000 people with 700 Jewish settlers living right in the centre. The Jewish settlements in the West Bank are illegal under international law – the Fourth Geneva Convention prevents an occupying power, in this case Israel, transferring their citizens into occupied territory. The settlers want to be there because Abraham and his family were buried in Hebron nearly 4,000 years ago and King Herod built a tomb on the site. The building's a particularly important place of worship for Jews, Muslims and Christians.

About 800 Israeli military personnel create a security zone for the settlers in the heart of the city. Palestinians can only access their homes, schools, places of work and the mosque where Abraham is buried by going through military checkpoints. One of our tasks was to monitor these checkpoints as a protective presence. It's well-documented that military personnel commit fewer human rights violations when under scrutiny. When we witnessed abuses against civilians we took photos and made notes, sending reports of incidents to the UN
