As part of increasing biodiversity, there will be no grass cutting undertaken along the verges or Greens for the whole of May this year. This is in keeping with other Parish and Town Councils to aid biodiversity. Enstone Parochial Church Council will be responsible for the upkeep of the churchyard and cemetery.

Bench – Top of Cleveley Road

Oxfordshire County Council seeking "super users" to help identify pot holes etc. Can this be you?

The county council is calling on residents to put themselves forward to train and volunteer as "super users." Under the scheme people will be given training in identifying and assessing things like potholes, blocked drains and damaged signs along with guidance on working safely on the roads, they will be authorised not only to make reports but also to order repairs to be carried out. Volunteers will only be expected to cover their local area on mainly residential or quieter roads and will be assessed to ensure they can use the systems and carry out "Super-User requirements safely. *Please contact me if you are interested in being a super-user for Enstone Parish Thank you ...*

This includes looking in the streams for signs of life, which can tell us a lot about the health of the rivers. If you would like to learn more, then you are welcome to register and come along to learn how to monitor the number of riverfly larvae in our local river Glyme.

Riverfly monitoring Saturday 13th April 10 - 4pm. The Evenlode Catchment Partnership (ECP) are providing free training workshop for anyone interested in learning about finding riverflies and their larvae. The aim is to encourage volunteers to regularly monitor riverfly larvae in our local rivers to provide more information on the health of this precious environment. It's also really good fun! The Enstone Village Hall and the Heythrop Warners Hotel have allowed us to use their facilities for the day. We shall use Heythrop stream to learn how to sample the riverfly after our indoor session in the morning. OXFORD COUNTY COUNCIL COMMUNITY UPDATE Your views needed

As a representative of a local business or organisation in the county, Oxfordshire Fire and Rescue Service would like to get your views on proposals to reduce the number of false alarms from automatic fire alarm systems. This would mean that more fire engines would be available for genuine emergencies.

It's Food Action Week

Food Waste Action Week is a national campaign from WRAP designed to reduce the amount of food waste people produce. This year's theme is 'Choose what you'll use' – promoting the benefits of buying loose fruit and veg. It's running from 18-24 March.

EV Car Clubs

We are working with city and district councils - and a number of commercial car club operators - offering fully battery electric cars for residents to use on a pay-per-use basis. This can be for as little as an hour, and up to a few days. There has never been a better time to give car clubs a go so please spread the word!

Fostering

We're recruiting for more foster carers and would be really grateful if you could spread the word with your communities. Hear from those already doing this amazing job, just what it means to care for a child.

Local Nature Recovery Strategy

We need to identify locations to create or improve habitat in a way that brings the greatest benefits for nature and the wider environment. This is a new statutory duty for authorities across England and we want to capture the views of as many people as possible.

Swap to Stop

We want to help residents stop smoking. But many smokers become disheartened after trying to quit without success.

Vaping is much less harmful than smoking. It's also one of the best tools for quitting smoking – significantly more effective than nicotine patches or gum.

Public Switched Telephone Network Withdrawal

Between now and 2025, most telephone providers such as Virgin Media, O2 or BT will be moving their customers from old analogue landlines over to new upgraded landline services using digital technology.

This means services that rely on the old landline system such as home phones and healthcare devices will no longer work and will need to be changed. For most residents, this change will be straightforward and communications providers will explain directly to their customers that the change may be as simple as plugging their phone into a broadband router rather than the socket on the wall.

For other, more vulnerable residents who are not already online, it will be more involved. We're sharing information on this with those who use our services. If you are able to, please do use the supplied information in your own communities.

Home Upgrade Grant

We know many residents are concerned about the cost of energy bills this winter $[\underline{s}_{P}]$

They may be eligible for energy efficiency upgrades for their home. These upgrades, known as 'retrofitting', can help to reduce energy bills and make homes easier to keep warm.
